Earl Y. Cheng

Dr. Cheng is the Division Head of Pediatric Urology and the Founder's Board Chair of Pediatric Urology at The Ann and Robert H. Lurie Children's Hospital of Chicago. He is also a professor of urology at The Feinberg School of Medicine at Northwestern University. He completed his residency training at Northwestern and did a two-year fellowship in pediatric urology at Children's Memorial Hospital (now Lurie Children's), during which time he was named a scholar of the American Foundation for Urologic Disease and participated in a physician/scientist training grant from the NIH.

Dr. Cheng is widely published, with over 200 peer-reviewed publications, book chapters, and reviews. He has held numerous leadership positions in various organizations, including the AAP, Society of Pediatric Urology, and the Spina Bifida Association of America. He is past-Chair of the Section of Urology of the AAP and is co-Chair of the SPU/AUA Task Force on Differences of Sex Development.

Dr. Cheng has special interests in complex urinary tract reconstruction, hypospadias, and differences of sex development. He also works in the basic science laboratory in conjunction with Arun Sharma, PhD, at the Simpson Querry Institute for Bionanotechnology and Medicine. Their current research focus is on different methods of promoting tissue-specific regeneration in the urinary tract, with an emphasis on bladder regeneration.
